THE BYRON BAY MURDERS

A true crime documentary series that unearths a haunting pattern of disappearances and deaths along Australia's idyllic east coast, from Newcastle to Byron Bay.

Across four decades, at least 67 women—mostly aged between 14 and 20—have either vanished or been found murdered under disturbingly similar circumstances. In the wake of personal tragedy, MP Jeremy Buckingham embarks on a deeply personal and relentless investigation, exposing a legacy of unanswered questions and institutional failure. From the earliest cases of Leanne Goodall, Robyn Hickie, and Amanda Robinson in the 1970s, to more recent tragedies like Theo Hayez and Jackson Stacker, families speak out after decades of silence, determined to reveal the truth.

The series confronts the possibility of a wider network of predators and questions long-standing assumptions about Ivan Milat, Australia's most infamous serial killer. In a chilling twist, a letter from a woman named "Mary" introduces new suspects, alleged evidence, and the possibility of other killers still at large.

With the help of criminologists, former detectives, and digital storytellers, the series dives into the failures of law enforcement, the evolution of forensic science, and the tireless resilience of those left behind. Byron Bay Murders asks the urgent and unsettling question: how many predators have gone undetected, and how close might justice still be?
