THE TOOLBOX MURDERS

The Toolbox Murders is a two-part true-crime documentary that tells the story of the 2016 murders of Corey Breton and Iuliana Triscaru in Queensland, Australia. It traces how both victims disappeared in late January, only to be found days later inside a large metal lockbox submerged in Scrubby Creek, near Gympie. They had been bound, tortured, and left to drown—crimes investigators describe as among the most brutal the state has seen.

Over the course of the series, the documentary follows nearly eight years of investigation, courtroom battles, appeals, and public interest in the case. It details how suspicion centered on Stou Daniels, who allegedly orchestrated the torture and murder under paranoia that Corey was a police informant. The series presents court testimony, police statements, and archival evidence to dismantle the roles played by Daniels and his co-accused, showing how the legal system worked to ensure accountability for the torture and killings.

The miniseries weaves together victim background, investigative breakthroughs, and trial outcomes. It offers a sobering portrait of extreme violence, betrayal, and a justice system's determination to prosecute one of Queensland's most notorious crimes.
